Tips on Staying Safe for Women, (and Men?)

The elbow is the strongest point on your body. If you are close enough to use it, do!

If you are ever thrown into the trunk of a car, kick out the back tail lights and stick your arm out the hole and start waving like crazy. The driver won't see you but everybody else will. This has saved lives.

Last night I attended a personal safety workshop, given by Pat Malone, who has been a bodyguard for famous figures like Farah Fawcett and Sylvester Stallone. He works for the FBI and teaches police officers and Navy SEALs hand-to-hand combat.

This man has seen it all, and knows a lot. He focused his teachings on HOW TO AVOID BEING THE VICTIM OF A VIOLENT CRIME. He gave some statistics about how much the occurrences of random violence have escalated over the recent years, and it's terrible. Something like 99% of us (?) will be exposed to, or become a victim of, a violent crime.

Here are some of the most important points:

(1). The three reasons women are easy targets for random acts of violence are:

(a.) Lack of Awareness: You MUST know where you are & what's going on around you.

(b.) Body Language: Keep your head up, swing your arms, stand straight up.

(c.) Wrong Place, Wrong Time: DON'T walk alone in an alley, or drive in a bad neighborhood at night.

(2). Women have a tendency to get into their cars after shopping, eating, working, etc., and just sit (doing their checkbook, or making a list, etc.) DON'T DO THIS! The predator will be watching you, and this is the perfect opportunity for him to get in the passenger side, put a gun to your head, and tell you where to go. AS SOON AS YOU GET INTO YOUR CAR, LOCK THE DOORS AND DRIVE AWAY.

(a.) A few notes about getting into your car in a parking lot, or parking garage: Be aware: look around you, look into your car, at the passenger side floor, and in the back seat.

(b.) If you are parked next to a big van, enter your car from the passenger door -- lock the doors before sliding across the seat! Most serial killers attack their victims by pulling them into their vans while the women are attempting to get into their cars.

(c.) Look at the car parked on the driver's side of your vehicle, and the passenger side. If a male is sitting alone in the seat nearest your car, you may want to walk back into the mall, or work, and get a guard/policeman to walk you back out. IT IS ALWAYS BETTER TO BE SAFE THAN SORRY. (And better paranoid than dead.)

(3.) ALWAYS take the elevator instead of the stairs. (Stairwells are horrible places to be alone and the perfect crime spot).

(4.) If the predator has a gun and you are not under his control, ALWAYS RUN!

(a.) The predator will only hit you (a running target) 4 in 100 times. And even then, it most likely WILL NOT be a vital organ. RUN!

(5.) As women, we are always trying to be sympathetic: STOP IT! It may get you raped, or killed.

(a.) Ted Bundy, the serial killer, was a good looking, well educated man, who ALWAYS played on the sympathies of unsuspecting women. He walked with a cane, or a limp, and often asked "for help" into his vehicle, or with his vehicle, which is when he abducted his next victim.

(b.) Pat Malone told the story of his daughter, who came out of the mall and was walking to her car when she noticed 2 older ladies in front of her. BESIDES, A LOT OF THESE THINGS MIGHT KEEP A MAN FROM BEING A CAR JACKING OR ROBBERY VICTIM!

Send this to any woman you know who may need to be reminded that the world we live in has a lot of crazes in it....better safe than sorry.

If your telephone number is unlisted, this doesn't apply to you. But if you ARE listed, this is kind of scary. **I checked it out and it does work.** For anyone that has kids fooling around on the internet, this is good to know.

Google has implemented a new feature wherein you can type someone's telephone number into the search bar and hit enter. Then you will be given the name, address, and a map to their house.

Think about it, if a child, a single person, ANYONE gives out his or her phone number, someone can actually now look it up to find out where he or she lives.

The safety issues are obvious, and alarming. This is not a hoax; Map quest will actually put a star on your house on your street.

In order to test whether your phone number is mapped, go to <http://www.google.com> and type your phone number in the search bar with dashes (i.e. 310-XXX-XXXX) and hit enter.

NOTE: If your phone number is not publicly listed, you should be fine. **If you want to BLOCK Google from divulging your private information,** simply click on the telephone icon next to your phone number. You will see a link where you are allowed to REMOVE yourself.

Bounce Dryer Sheets

Not sure where this originated from. The items seem worth investigating. I used "static sheets" on monitor screens and they appear to work well. Al

Safety

Concerns of safety issues in our shops, studios, or whatever we call our places where we work with lapidary concerns and jewelry making.

1. Ventilation: either have enough room or have some way to get enough fresh air that there is no danger of breathing problems.

2. Eye safety: a pair of safety glasses (either prescription or goggles) are needed when using machinery and rocks or minerals. In breaking stones, sawing stones, grinding stones, or polishing stones small pieces of rock could hit your eye and cause damage.

3. Chemicals that we use: care should be taken to be extremely safety minded when we use these toxic chemicals. Follow directions on the containers. Most chemicals that mix with water should be mixed into water, not water added to the chemicals.

4. Storage of chemicals: they should always be stored in a safe place with a good cover on them and out of reach of small children. I try to store mine in a wood rack with wooden dividers between the bottles or containers. They should always be labeled properly.



A few DO NOTS:

A. Do not store gasoline or use it in a room where have a gas water heater or any gas appliances with pilot lights.

B. Do not haul acetylene in a closed trunk or car or truck cab without at least two windows open at least two inches. When there is an acetylene leak enough gas might build up to cause an explosion.

C. Do not try to use tools or torches when you are drowsy from medication. In fact it is a good idea to rest a little while before you go into your shop if you feel tired or sleepy.

D. Do not forget ventilation.
