What is Normal Memory Loss

People past the age of 40 worry about their memory loss because they have slow recall, or they lose track of things. There are two good reasons these people are most likely to be completely healthy and with normal memory loss.

1. Difficultly recalling names or the inability to find the right word. They are experiencing Slow Memory not broken memory.

The proof is that, once reminded of (the name they could not recall), they instantly recalled it.

This establishes that the information was still stored in their memory. They just had not been able to recall it as quickly as they would have liked.

2. Losing track of things and not following through on details.

There are many things to think about in a given day - more than at a younger age - a job, a spouse, children, bills to pay, elder parents to care for, etc.,

As the demands grow, it becomes more difficult to flawlessly administer the burden of a daily routine, especially given that the ability to block out competing information declines naturally as we age.

The problem is generally distraction and/or overload, and Normal Memory Loss.

When neither of the reasons apply, and the person truly cannot store and retrieve important information the memory loss is Real and, more important, never normal.

When memory loss is real, there will be an underlying cause of the problem that an enlightened doctor can diagnose and treat.

If your doctor says it is "just old age" and neither of the two reasons above (slow recall and lack of focus) seems to apply, you should seek a second opinion from another doctor.

Mar 22-23 Lavic Siding Area: Jasper, thulite, agates and others.

Apr 26-27 Pinto Basin: Mines and mining history, turquoise and other minerals associated with the Dale Mining District.

May 17 Wrightwood: Actinolite and visits to sites along the San Andreas Fault

June (TBA) Cerro Gordo Mine: Historical Ghost Town and minerals associated with the mining of silver, lead, and zinc. Noted as a location to find Smithsonite.

July 12 Palos Verdes: Glaucofane, barite and agate minerals.



Don Warthen suggested having a club set up the club part of the show on Thursday June 5, 2014 and have the vendors set up on Friday June 6, 2014. The vendors can have set up times on Friday June 6, 2014 to be finished with set up by show opening at 4: 00 P.M., June 6, 2014.

There were concerns that the electrical equipment set up would be a mess as it was at the NOC Federation show in Whittier. But it was discussed that Phil Pasha has full confidence in Sunbelt Electrics ability to provide all electrical equipment including the spider junction boxes and safety trip covers for our show floor. Richard O'Connor spoke and said to remind the vendors about bringing fluorescent an LED lights and including a 25 foot maximum extension cord as they will need to supply their own electric to the spider junction boxes or electric wall plugs.

On February 8, 2014 at 11:00 AM - The show committee and members will meet at the show location which is located at Sonora High School on

401 South Palm St., La Habra CA.

We will meet in the parking lot outside the Gym *below the Raiders Mascot* (big horse and rider) which is painted on the wall. We will be having a visual review

of the show location to aid in the show design and layout.

Nancy and Richard O'Connor will be in charge of the cases this year.

Teri will be gathering the donation from the Vendors and requested Nancy to inform the Vendors of that needed donation also collecting donation from the community and our members. At the show Teri and Valeria Ruzgy's will be setting up and working the Donation Awards Booth during the show.

Nancy Bird is going to supply a donation award letter to use for our donors.

Loretta Ogden will be the person in charge of the demonstrators.

Nancy Bird received a suggestion from Mark Sturdvenant to change up our promotion image with a picture of people at our show or persons viewing cases or specimens for our show cards versus just a mineral. Also Nancy B would like to have the show cards done on Glossy card stock. We had a discussion on printers and Jann had a suggestion of one printer she uses and Don Ogden suggested we use one of our members' Clyeta's husband printing company TnT Printing as they have done our club printing for years. The printer has not been determined at this time.

Richard O'Connor has a connection with James Hardware and the tall gentleman Dave said he would allow us to display our promotion on or in his store. Dave stated he is an advocate of the high schools and their agriculture 4H programs. We need to see if we can gather last year's fairs promotion material to provide us with ideas to include our logo/brand to the group branding on the fair promotion materials. Note: Have Alan request that information from Bruce to ask their Promotion committee for the material.

Don Warthen suggested that we include a booth for the BLM land, geology departments, and the parks and recreation, the water district if they would like to have information booths at our show. Don Warthen stated he would call his connection to see if they would like to participate in our show. Another suggestion from Don W is that there are two clubs and never have their own shows and he suggested that we allow The Carvers and Faceting club to be a part of our show with their own little mini show as they are interesting and the public rarely sees these groups.

Frank Winn suggested we get our ad in the Rock & Gem magazine ASAP. Nancy B said she would get that into the magazine she was waiting until the dates and location was confirmed. Frank also stated he would do an electrical cord update on our clubs own electrical equipment.


After the Bulletin presentation, Gene who is an author and had books for sale. I bought two books:
