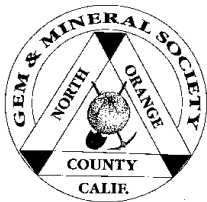

Zzyzx, What Is It, And Where Did It Come From?

You have heard us talking about Zzyzx and why everyone should go, but do know what Zzyzx is?

Zzyzx was met to be the last name is the phone book. Zzyzx, a resort that was founded by self-proclaimed “old time medicine man,” Curtis Howe Springer. He founded a Mineral hot Springs Resort and Health Spa in the Soda Springs area of the Mojave Desert. Curtis Springer was an interesting character to say the least. the American Medical Association subsequently dubbed him “the King of Quacks,”. His intention was to create an appealing place for high end guests to spend their money while he invested a minimal amount of his own money to get it off the ground.

He Built faux hot springs (pools heated by a broiler), broadcasting from a radio station while requesting donations in trade for miracle cures to major ailments, and recruiting a group of homeless men to construct an airport, a church, and a castle for the resort are all pieces of what make this endeavor so intriguing.

His big down fall was to start selling time-shares in Zzyzx, he sold more spaces then he had. the Bureau of Land Management took issue with Springer’s original claim to mining rights on the land, in fact the BLM held that the land where Springer had built his resort was acutely on BLM land.

After years of haggling Springer was evicted from the land and he was sent to Federal Prison. The BLM took over Zzyzx and let it sit there and detreat over the years until finely they entered in to a deal with California State University where the university developed an Earth Science Studies program.

Cal State has refurbished the property and is conducting Earth Science Studies there. The CFMS has the privilege to use Zzyzx one week a year and they have some of the finest earth science studies and lapidary that can be found anywhere. They have such classes as Cabbing, Faceting, copper enameling, metal clay, carving, wire wrap, silver fabrication, and much much more, they also have some great meals there.

Please note that the CFMS has two earth science programs Zzyzx in the springtime at Soda Springs and Camp Paradise in the fall at Clipper Mills, in Norther California. all members of the CFMS needs to take advantage of these programs.
