



## Geological time gets a new period

Geologists have added a new period to their official calendar of Earth's history the first in 120 years.

The Ediacaran Period covers some 50 million years of ancient time on our planet from 600 million years ago to about 542 million years ago.

It officially becomes part of the Neoproterozoic, when multicelled life forms started to take hold on Earth.


However, Russian geologists are unhappy their own title - the Vendian - which was coined in 1952, was not chosen.

The decision was taken after a fifteen-year long period of consideration by expert geologists.



Ediacaran organisms appear after a series of ice ages that covered the Earth

"There's always been a recognition that the last part of the Precambrian is a special time before the first shelled animals, when there are these weird, mesh-like creatures of uncertain affinity," Professor Jim Ogg, secretary-general of the International Commission on Stratigraphy (ICS), told BBC News Online.



"These organisms were probably ripped to shreds when the first predators came along. That probably happened in the Cambrian Period."

The proposal had to pass three balloting stages, first by the members of the ICS's Terminal Proterozoic Period subcommission (which was set up specifically to consider the Ediacaran question), then by the ICS itself and finally by the International Union of Geological Sciences (IUGS) which ratified the definition in March.

At each stage, the vote had to be passed by two-thirds of the voting members.

However, Russian geologists are likely to continue to call the period by its alternative name: the Vendian.

In 1952, the Russian geologist Boris Sokolov coined the term Vendian for a system of sedimentary rocks in the former Soviet Union.

#### Public Comment Period Open NOW for Southern Utah BLM Management Plans - A. Hoekstra

Would you like to again have the opportunity to collect rocks, minerals, and petrified wood and common invertebrate fossils on some of the lands where hobby collecting was banned in 1996 with the creation of the Grand Staircase Escalante National Monument (GSENM)? The BLM is considering this and wants your input. Note that lands already removed (per Presidential Proclamation 9682) from the manument remain closed to hobby collecting, pending a new management plan – the excluded land has not reverted to its previous status.

There is a November 30<sup>th</sup> deadline to make comments on the BLM proposals for future management of the lands excluded from the GSENM - now referred to as the Kanab-Escalante Planning Area - and also on the management plan for the lands retained within the GSENM.

For each management area, the BLM has discusses four alternative proposals. Public comments will influence their drafting of a final Resource Management Plan (which may include elements from any or all of the four draft proposals). Hobby rock collecting will be regulated identically to hobby collecting of common invertebrate and botanical (petrified wood) fossils – it will be allowed or prohibited in the same areas – as described under "Paleontological Resources" section of the plan alternatives (p. 3-44 in <u>Draft RMP and EIS Vol. 1</u>).

For the Kanab-Escalante Planning Area, the proposed alternative 'D', which is the BLM's "preferred alternative," would allow hobby collecting of rocks, minerals, and common invertebrate and botanical fossils, including petrified wood, within almost the entire area excluded from the monument. Alternative D also proposes to allow hobby collecting in two defined areas within the GSENM. Rock hounds should support alternative 'D' in respect to the Paleontological Resources provisions (it is not necessary to support alternative D in whole or overall). You can submit a comment online (<a href="https://eplanning.blm.gov/epl-front-office/eplanning/comments/commentSubmission.do?commentPeriodId=70905">https://eplanning.blm.gov/epl-front-office/eplanning/comments/commentSubmission.do?commentPeriodId=70905</a>) or by mail.

Clubs should consider co-signing a joint letter that would incorporate evidence in support of our position. The Southern California Paleontological Society, a CFMS club, will draft a comment letter, preferably with participation of individuals representing other clubs (for information, please contact: ajhoekstra@yahoo.com).

Note that for lands excluded from the Bears Ears NM rock hounding is not banned, and will not be banned: there is no new management plan being proposed for the area excluded from the BENM. For lands remaining inside the BENM, only the proposed alternative 'A', the "No Change" alternative, would allow rock hounding in the monument. Rock hounds may want to comment on the Paleontological Resources provisions of the BENM proposals (no statute exists that bans rock hounding within BLM national monuments; is it really necessary to prohibit all hobby collecting of rocks or common fossils to protect scientifically significant fossils – i.e., dinosaur bones? Are all the rocks and common fossils actually being utilized for scientific research, or are they just weathering away? Is not rock collecting a traditional hobby and family activity, educational? In fact, don't amateurs often cooperate with professionals and contribute to scientific research on common fossils? Doesn't the PRPA, a legislative statute - or "law" - designate BLM lands as appropriate for hobby collecting?).

#### ARTICLE V OFFICERS

#### SECTION 1 OFFICES

The officers of this society shall consist of a President, a First Vice-President, a Second Vice-President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and a Federation Director, and five (5) elected Directors each of whom shall serve as a chairman of a standing committee appointed by the President.

#### SECTION 2 NOMINATIONS

- A. A nominating committee consisting of five (5) members shall be selected at the September meeting in the following manner; the President shall appoint one (1), the Board of Directors will elect one (1), and the Society shall elect three (3).
- B. It shall be the duty of the nominating committee to nominate one or more members in good standing as candidates for each of the offices to be filled. The names of all candidates nominated by this committee shall be presented to the membership in the October bulletin prior to the October meeting.
- Further nominations for office by the membership from the floor shall be allowed at the October meeting.
- D. A complete list of all names nominated by the committee and those nominated by the membership from the floor at the October meeting as candidates for office shall be published in the November bulletin prior to the November meeting and election. No further nominations shall be allowed at this time.

#### SECTION 3 ELECTIONS

Election of officers shall be held on the first regular meeting in November. Voting shall be by secret ballot. The candidate receiving the greatest number of votes cast on the ballot for that office shall be declared elected. Voting shall be restricted to senior members in good standing.

#### SECTION 4 TERM OF OFFICE

Officers and Directors shall serve for a term of two (2) years from the date of election and/or until their successors are elected and qualified, except the Federation Director shall be elected for term of 3 years.
